There are times when you might have to carry a 50 lb. bladder bag and a hand tool to the top of a mountain and once there, you could be expected to dig fireline, perform mop-up, do burn-outs and back-fire, drag hose, or any other wildland firefighting operations. You could do this for many consecutive hours, including nighttime hours. Additionally, wildland firefighting can be dangerous and can pose a serious threat to your well being by exposure to heat and/or smoke. You will also have to pass a moderate pack test, which consists of carrying a 25 lb. pack 2 miles in less than 30 min.
